Dear Bishop Hartley Parents and Students:

As we approach the end of another successful school year, the Administration would like to take this opportunity to applaud the efforts of our parents, students, and teachers. We applaud your generosity, commitment, and hard work. We applaud your spirit of sacrifice for the good of others and your willingness to work together for a common goal. That common goal lies in the fact that we support the same values in both the home and the school and that together we can encourage our youth to live as Jesus taught.

We are the Light of the World, May Our Light Shine Before All.

This year's theme – taken from the hymn “We are the Light of the World” – has served the Bishop Hartley community well and has provided inspiration during the 2007-2008 school year. Mrs. Recchie and I are proud and encouraged that at the beginning of the year, during homecoming week, each class adopted a year-long service project meant to “shine their light before all.” The seniors provided service to the Joint Organization for Inner City Needs (J.O.I.N.) by collecting items at Bishop Hartley and then organizing them at the J.O.I.N. facility. The juniors worked to collect items for the Bishop Griffin Center, a free store located at Christ the King Parish. The sophomore class raised money for the Maryknoll organization to help children impacted by AIDS. The freshman class visited nursing homes including St. Mary's of the Springs. An all-school student council project consisted of supporting Birthright, an organization that assists mothers and families in need in an effort to reduce abortions. Students held a fundraiser and then used the money collected to purchase baby items for this organization. It is clear that the Bishop Hartley community understands St. James' proclamation: “For just as a body without a spirit is dead, so also faith without works is dead.”

Mrs. Recchie and I would also like to thank the Class of '08. This Senior Class exhibited great leadership and we have an inkling that they will give the Class of '07 a run for their “money” in regard to its 5.5 million dollars awarded in college scholarships last year.

So as we pause for a moment to remember that we are completing another school year and to catch a glimpse of summer fun, let us be cautious of pausing too long because there are still several important weeks of school. Students, teachers, and parents alike must rise to the challenge of

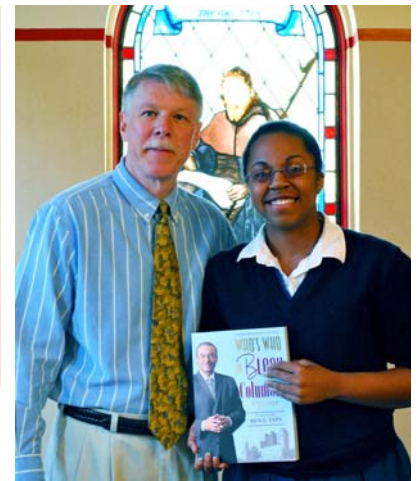

Students can watch for flyers to be posted in the school for more details.

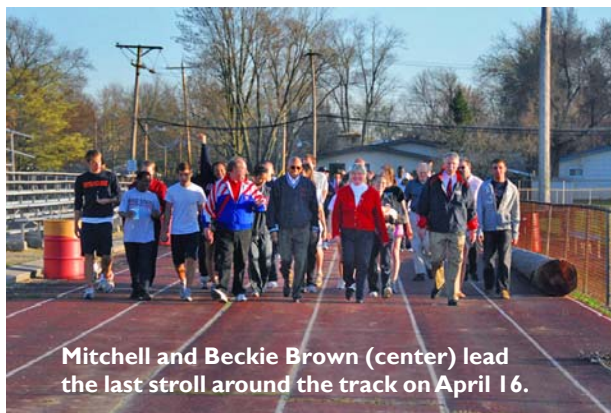
2008 Evening of Excellence

Body image -- how one perceives, thinks, or feels about one's body -- is not necessarily based upon fact, but is influenced by our sense of self worth rather than actual physical attractiveness as judged by others. Our body image is something we learn as a result of influence from other people -- family, peers, media or interactions we have within our culture. Because it is learned, there are ways to change a negative body image to a more positive view of oneself.

Few would argue today that we haven't seen a "general lowering of morality" since Pope Paul VI boldly reiterated the teachings of the Catholic Church concerning contraception.
