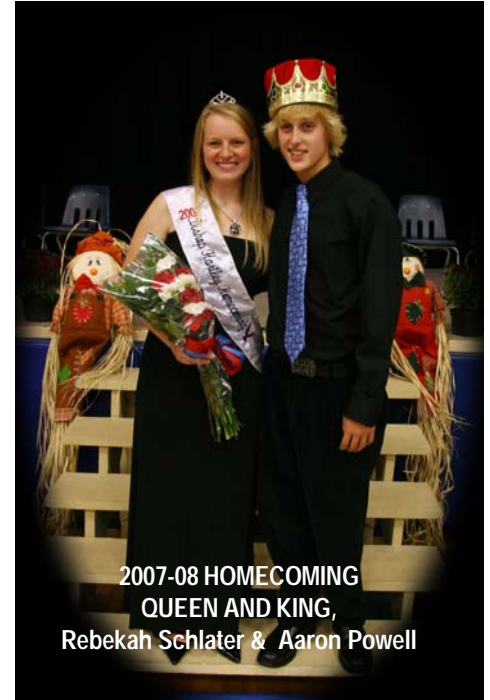

HOMECOMING WEEK, September 24-29, 2007, for Bishop Hartley's 50th Anniversary year began on **Monday** with a Homecoming Mass celebrated by Father Ted Thomas, Pastor of St. Mary-German Village Parish. It was a double celebration that morning when the Bishop Hartley community learned it was Father Thomas' 60th birthday, too! Following Mass, each class proposed their year-long service project to the school: Freshmen will visit local nursing homes, focusing on Mohun Health Care Center at St. Mary of the Springs; Sophomores will help children who are suffering from illnesses and homelessness by assisting local Catholic organizations; Juniors will work at Christ the King Parish to help get the new free store for Catholic Social Services up and running; and Seniors will serve in the JOIN office. On **Tuesday** during the week, a Fall Sports and Activities Assembly honoring all those participants, and especially all those seniors who are involved in their last year with their fall sports and activities, was held in the gymnasium. **Wednesday** marked a themed dress-up day. This year, the theme was *The 60s*. On **Thursday**, students were invited to dress in their favorite college clothes and, in the evening, the Homecoming 2007 King and Queen – Aaron Powell and Rebekah Schlater — were announced at the traditional homecoming gathering. Although rain cancelled the traditional bonfire, Hawk "can-do" spirit kept the indoor ceremony upbeat and exciting. **Friday** marked a Red and Blue Spirit dress day and Pep Rally in preparation for the game against Columbus Crusaders in the evening. The week was capped off with a Homecoming Dance on **Saturday**, where James Bond attire was fitting for the theme of "Casino Royale-007". See *the Hawks fly heights unbounded...*

PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES. Mark your calendars for our Parent-Teacher Conferences scheduled for Thursday, November 15 from 3:30 to 8:30 PM. After you receive your student's report card, which will be mailed on November 2, you may make appointments with any of his/her teachers. Each scheduled conference is 15 minutes in length and Mrs. Samuelson will help you arrange a convenient meeting time so that you may touch base with any of the teachers. Teachers will accept drop-in visits until 8 PM if they have unscheduled time.

8th GRADE SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE. A reminder to those with 8th graders that Bishop Hartley Scholarship applications are to be postmarked **no later than October 31, 2007**. As part of your application, you must include your choice of testing dates – Saturday, November 3 or Monday, November 5. Guidance Department

TESTING DAY. All Juniors, Sophomores and Freshmen will participate in testing on Wednesday, October 17. The day will begin at the normal time, 7:50 AM so it is very important that students arrive on time. Juniors will take the PSAT and will be dismissed following the test at 11:05 AM. Sophomores will also take the PSAT, have lunch and then attend the *Sober Truth* program (which reinforces the importance of an alcohol- and drug-free lifestyle) and a session on college planning. Freshmen will take the Campbell Interest Inventory, have lunch, vote for class officers and attend the *Making High School Count* presentation, which was developed to motivate freshmen to make the most of their high school experience. Freshmen and sophomores will be dismissed at 12:55 PM; busses will pick up students at 1 PM. Seniors do not have school this day and are encouraged to visit colleges and universities.

SOPHOMORE PARENT MEETING. Our Guidance Department has planned a Sophomore Parents Information Night for Thursday, November 15 at 7:30 PM in the cafeteria. Since historically over 98% of our students attend a 2 or 4-year college following graduation, and planning for college requires more complex decisions than it did a decade ago, it is necessary to begin the planning process early. Our counselors will explain the work they are doing to prepare your students for post-secondary education and careers and the role you can play in this process. At the meeting, you will receive a copy of your child's transcript which includes the freshman year grade point average. You will also be given the results and an explanation of the PLAN test that will be administered on Wednesday, October 10. The results of the PSAT taken on October 17 will be returned to students before Christmas break.

Tuition assistance applications for the 2008-2009 academic year will be mailed out much earlier this year. **You will have them in your homes before Christmas break.** To be considered for the Diocese of Columbus Tuition Assistance Program and/or the Bishop Hartley Tuition Assistance Program:

- Your student must be registered in one of the Diocesan schools by March 15, 2008.
- A signed and completed application with **ALL** supporting documentation must be postmarked by the **March 15, 2008 deadline.** Supporting documentation includes copies of your 2007 IRS Federal Form 1040, 1040A or 1040 EZ and 2007 W-2 Wage and Tax Statements.

Mission Statement Our mission is to provide a quality Catholic education emphasizing Christ's teaching in all phases of the educational process and to empower each student to mature spiritually, morally, intellectually, physically, and socially.

Healthy Hawks

As I begin my second year at Bishop Hartley as its school nurse, I'd like to take the opportunity to clarify my role and purpose so that I can better serve the students, staff and Bishop Hartley families. School nurses can and do pass out band-aids and ice packs, and it is nice to have a nurse on hand in a medical emergency, but my job entails so much more.

The most obvious and enjoyable part of my job is providing for the immediate physical needs of the students and staff. Students who take prescription medication on a daily basis or those who anticipate frequent need of over-the-counter (OTC) medication can come to me for administration of such medication with the proper completed authorization forms. I ensure that sick students can rest while I contact their parents or guardians for a ride home. I can also provide a student with a rest on my cot, a quiet place to "chill out", or an attentive ear.

In addition to providing direct nursing care, I collect and review the health and immunization records of all incoming freshmen and new students. I review them for health problems or concerns and accuracy. This process is completed during the first few weeks of the school year. All school nurses must report the immunization status of new students to the Ohio Department of Health. As parents, you can help with this process by providing these records in a timely manner. By keeping me aware of your student's changing health needs or medications, you allow me to be an effective health advocate for your child while he/she is at school.

I complete health screenings -- vision, hearing, weight and blood pressure -- on all freshmen in the fall. Juniors are screened in the spring for blood pressure only. I notify parents of any abnormalities or concerns and I will refer your student if necessary for further evaluation by an appropriate healthcare professional.

As a school nurse, I am also a health educator and promoter. I train cafeteria proctors in the Heimlich method of removing an airway obstruction, and instruct the school's Medical Disaster Response Team and other interested staff in CPR and First Aid. When possible, I collaborate with our health teachers in providing health education and promotion of topics such as CPR, proper nutrition, and sexual abstinence, and I help with Hartley's spring Blood Drive, where last year we collected 65 usable units of blood. *This year I am joining efforts with the Ohio Department of Health to provide the local community with both a Flu Shot Clinic and an informational workshop on how to respond to the Pan Flu Epidemic. These will be scheduled at Bishop Hartley on November 14 from 7-8:30 PM in the D-Wing Lecture Hall.*

Stay well and please keep me advised when it comes to health and wellness issues. I can be reached at 365-8167 on Tuesday, Thursday, or Friday. Your comments, questions -- and students -- are always welcome in my office.

Mr. Bob Grove, Department of Science Chairman, reports that the new science class, *Introduction to Astronomy*, is off and running. This new class is modeled after Astronomy 101 at The Ohio State University. It is a semester course worth 0.5 credits. Prerequisites are a minimum grade of B in a student's previous science course and completion of geometry. This first semester there are 25 students in Mr. Grove's class and the same number are scheduled for Semester II. The course syllabus is designed to cover the basic principles of astronomy which, in addition to studying the sun, moon, and stars, includes the study of astronomy's historical development and space exploration.
