As we approach the beginning of the 2008-2009 school year, I would like to take this opportunity to welcome all of you. For many, it is a greeting extended to old friends of Bishop Hartley; to others, it is an introduction and an invitation. To all, it constitutes a pledge of continued efforts to provide the best possible Catholic education for our young men and women.

We want to thank you in advance for your support of Bishop Hartley and we recognize the sacrifice many of you make in sending your son/daughter to our school. The success of Catholic schools in general and Bishop Hartley in particular is beyond dispute. We can say with confidence that attending Bishop Hartley derives significant advantages – religious, academic, and social – not available to students who attend other schools.

This August, Bishop Hartley will open its doors for the fifty-second year with the same resolve in Catholic education as in year one. During our school's first fifty years, the spirit and tradition that is our school have played a key role in shaping the educational experience of our young people. ## ON-LINE STUDENT HANDBOOK

For the 2008-2009 school year, the Bishop Hartley Student Handbook will be posted in its entirety on-line. Students who are new to Bishop Hartley (i.e., freshmen, new upperclassmen/transfer students) will receive a copy of the handbook during their orientation on Tuesday, August 19. Current students in grades 10 -12 will have their prior year's copy to refer to at home, as well as the fully updated on-line version. **Please be aware that, when signing your Student Handbook Acceptance Form, you are responsible for the full content of the handbook as updated on-line.** An insert is provided with this newsletter which details significant policy changes to the handbook.

## STUDENT HANDBOOK &

**ACCEPTANCE FORM** The Student Handbook contains all the information pertaining to the philosophy, curriculum, rules and policies necessary for the operation of Bishop Hartley. Students and parents are expected to read this handbook carefully and sign the letter of agreement indicating their acceptance of our rules and regulations. **This is mandatory.** *The signed acceptance letters are due back to the school office no later than **Monday, August 25.***

## EMERGENCY MEDICAL

**AUTHORIZATION FORM** Every student must have this medical authorization form on file with our school nurse. This form will be given to each student during their class meetings on August 21-22. *The completed form will be due back no later than **Monday, August 25,** along with the handbook acceptance form.*

### Notes about Parking Registration

**All car pools will consist of 3 or more students.** A list of names in the car pool is required. Falsifying names will result in the loss of that space. *All car pool drivers must be there to register.*

Registered student drivers will have assigned parking spots that will correspond to the number on their tags. **When registering, each student will need to show a valid driver's license.**

#### Please note the following:

1. During the one hour block of time, parking spaces will be given on a first come-first served basis.

2. There will be no early registration; this includes teams that are practicing or playing in matches. Coaches were informed of this last May and have been asked to schedule accordingly.

3. **The 2008-09 registration fee per car is \$30.**

4. Have all pertinent information -- license plate number, make and model of car -- when you register. If several families are carpooling, make sure all drivers are there to register.

5. Any student driving to Bishop Hartley, whether parking on or off school grounds, must register his/her car.

6. You will be allowed to park only in your numbered space. Violators will be towed.

## Hawks Race to Four State Titles: June 7, 2008

Girls Team is State Runner-Up



**Aisha Cavin**, a freshman, was recently selected as a Central District top athlete by *The Columbus Dispatch* for her role in powering the Hawks to a district title and regional and state runner-ups. She won a state title in the 200 (25.17) and anchored the winning 400 relay (47.80)

The Hartley Hawks track teams were spectacular at the state meet at The Ohio State University on June 7, 2008. The girls team was state runner-up with outstanding performances by the following girls: in the 100 meter dash, CharAnna Dixon was first in 12.39 and Chesna Sykes was 3rd in 12.42; the girls 4 X 100 relay finished first, with a state record time in the preliminaries of 47.36 and a winning performance in the finals by Dixon, Sykes, Ashlee Hoffman and Aisha Cavin in 47.80; in the 200 meters Aisha Cavin finished first in 25.17, a new Hartley school

record, and Ashlee Hoffman 6th in 25.67; the girls 4 X 400 relay of Maya Pederson, Taisha Ferguson, Hoffman and Cavin was 5th in 4:05.57. The boys team finished 7th with a winning performance in the 200 meters by Rufus Walls in 21.95 and a 2nd place finish in the 4 X 400 relay. The relay team of Luke Evans, Noah Key, Dominic Colvin and Walls finished in a personal best time of 3:22.33. Congratulations and thank you for an outstanding season!

## New Students and Parents New to Bishop Hartley

**FRESHMAN ORIENTATION** All incoming freshmen will report for their first day of school on Tuesday, August 19 at the regular starting time of 7:50 AM. Please report to the gymnasium to assemble for a Mass together in the new St. James Chapel. The freshmen will attend Mass, receive class schedules, be given locker assignments, fill out various forms, walk through their schedules and meet with their teachers. Freshmen will also meet with Student Council and have their school and ID pictures taken. Please note the school picture envelope in this mailing. Freshmen will be dismissed at 12:30 PM. There will be no bus service on that day. Students staying for sports practices should pack a lunch, as there will be no lunch provided for freshmen that day. Freshmen are expected to be in full uniform which means that girls are in jumpers and blouses and boys are in slacks, shirts and ties. A summary of the dress code appears later in this newsletter.

**FRESHMAN & TRANSFER STUDENT PARENT MEETING** Parents of freshmen or transfer students will meet in the school gymnasium, Monday, August 18 at 7 PM. The purpose of this meeting will be to introduce administrators, address questions and concerns, verbalize expectations and meet with guidance counselors.

**TRANSFER STUDENT ORIENTATION & LUNCHEON** All sophomores and juniors new to Bishop Hartley should plan to attend the New Student Orientation on Tuesday, August 19 from 10:30 AM - Noon. New students will meet in the Guidance Classroom, meet with Student Council representatives, pick-up class schedules, and tour the building. ## Bishop Hartley High School Crisis Management Plan

In case of prolonged evacuation at Bishop Hartley, students and faculty will meet at Christ the King Church/All Saints Academy School located at 2855 E. Livingston Ave., phone 614.231.3391. In such a situation, students will be organized according to their Guidance Counselors as follows: A-G (Rees) in the church; H-N (Grannan) in the school gym; and O-Z (Marshall) in the school cafeteria.

## Dress Code 2008-09 School Year

### For Young Women

**Slacks** - Only navy blue or khaki slacks will be permitted from November 1 until April 1 and must be purchased through School Days Uniforms. All slacks will have the Hartley swoosh on the back pocket. Slacks must be worn with a blouse and a Bishop Hartley sweater or sweatshirt.

**Shoes** - **Black or brown leather dress shoes** and/or clean athletic shoes only. (Non-marking or mark resistant heels only). No longer will slides, clogs, slippers or sandals be permitted.

**Socks** - Red, blue or white knee socks and/or white athletic ankle socks. Girls may wear nylons or tights in a navy or nude color only.

**Footies are not permitted.**

**Belts with slacks** - Dark color only, worn and visible at all times

### For Young Men

**Slacks** - Only navy blue or khaki slacks will be permitted. All slacks must be purchased through School Days Uniform suppliers. All slacks will have the Hartley swoosh on the back pocket.

**Shoes** - **Black or brown leather dress shoes** and/or clean athletic shoes only. (Non-marking or mark resistant heels only).

**Socks** - Dark dress or white athletic socks. Footies are not permitted.

**Belts** - Dark color only, worn and visible at all times, *with conservative belt buckles only*

*Dress code regarding jumpers, shirts, blouses, ties, sweaters, sweatshirts, hair, facial hair, etc. will continue to be the same and can be found in the Student Handbook.*

## School-Time Vacation Policy

We strongly discourage families from planning vacations during scheduled school time. Vacation days, other than those that appear on the Diocesan approved Bishop Hartley school calendar, are unexcused absences. Unexcused absences negatively impact a student's performance due to the loss of instructional time. This loss can result in failure for the quarter and loss of course credit. However, if a parent chooses to remove a student from school, the parent must contact Mr. Winters by phone **at least three weeks** before the proposed vacation date. Mr. Winters will then schedule an appointment during which the parent will receive specific information regarding the guidelines for the student in completing make-up work.

1. Parents may request work in advance, but the teachers may not be able to provide any or all of it.
2. It is the responsibility of the student to pick up the assignments from his teachers on the last day prior to departure.
3. On the day the student returns to school, he is responsible for giving his teachers all the work that was assigned prior to his departure and for requesting from the teacher any additional work that was assigned while he was absent.
4. This additional work, plus any tests or quizzes, must be made up within three days of the student's return. Students should plan to stay after school during the 8<sup>th</sup> period the three days upon his return to gather assignments and to make up quizzes and tests.
5. Students may be unable to make up some work that was completed as part of a group project or as part of a class activity. They may have to take a '0' for this work.
6. The student is responsible for contacting his teachers to schedule a time to complete all missed tests or quizzes. Any work that is not complete within three days will be assigned a grade of '0'.
7. Parents need to be prepared to hire a tutor in cases where a student is not able to master new material on his own.
8. **New:** If a student misses a semester or final exam while on vacation, there will be a fee charged for make-up exam proctoring services.

## Locker Time

Again we are asking students to go to their lockers only 4 times during the school day: **beginning of school, after 2<sup>nd</sup> period (locker time provided), after lunch (locker time provided), and end of the day.** This practice will curb between-class tardies and more importantly, encourage organizational skills and maximize the number of instructional minutes during the academic day.

## After School Hours

We open our building as early as 7:15 AM and keep some areas of our building open for many activities and events in the evening. It is imperative that our students have proper supervision. **We are asking parents to please arrange for transportation home for their son or daughter by 3:30 PM.** Obviously, if your son or daughter is engaged in practice for a co-curricular activity and is properly supervised the student can remain until that activity is concluded. Otherwise, we will be clearing the hallways and locking the doors in order to begin cleaning our school for the next day. Please make arrangements now so there is no misunderstanding later in the year.

## Student Schedules

Freshmen will receive their permanent schedules on Tuesday, August 19 during Freshman Orientation. Upperclassmen will receive their permanent class schedule on the day and time of their parking registration. This permanent copy will also list the student's locker number and combination. Any inaccuracies will be handled by your guidance counselor (A-G: Miss Rees; H-N: Mr. Grannan; O-Z: Ms. Marshall) during the first week of school.

## From the Diocese

### *Living the Gospel: From Maintenance to Mission*

The Most Reverend Frederick F. Campbell, Bishop of Columbus, has initiated a strategic planning process for the Diocese of Columbus that commenced with a parish self-study in May 2008. The self study is meant to review local demographic and economic changes and assess the impact of those changes systematically across all parishes in the Diocese. The process is expected to result in strategies that facilitate how the people of the Diocese of Columbus live the mission of the Catholic Church and how Catholics will proclaim and live the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Parish results will be due to the deanery offices by August 2008. Parish results will be collated into reports by deanery for analysis by a Diocesan Pastoral and Strategic Planning Committee in November 2008, which will, in turn, be reviewed by the Bishop and consultative councils by January 2009. Implementation of the new strategic plans resulting from the study will begin in June 2009.

## ***DON'T BE TRUANT!***

### *Health Homework*

To be in compliance with the school health regulations students must:

- Return a completed and signed **Emergency Medical Authorization** Form within the first full week of school.
- Have a complete and up-to-date **immunization record** on file. If for medical or philosophical reasons immunizations have been declined a waiver form must be completed, signed, and on file in the health office. **See me to obtain this form.**
- Provide the school with a recent (within this year) **physical exam**. This applies to all incoming freshmen as well as all students planning to participate in a sport. OHSAA forms are available on line or in the school health office.
- Complete and return **Medication Authorization** permission forms to the nurse before any medication can be dispensed at school.

Please refer to the Diocesan Policy on Administering Medications to Students, section 514.1.0, found in the Student Handbook (p. 51). New this year, the handbook will be posted as a pdf document on-line for your convenience.

Please keep me advised regarding any health concerns or changes in medication that could potentially affect your student's health, well being and/or academic performance while here at Bishop Hartley.

## CANAL WINCHESTER

Does not offer transportation but does offer reimbursement. There is a form in the Bishop Hartley office that you may fill out for reimbursement, or you may contact Canal Winchester Board office directly: 837.4533, Barb Bitler.

## COLUMBUS

You must complete a form for transportation which you can find in the Bishop Hartley office. If bus service is not available in your area and you live in the Columbus Public Schools (CPS) district, you may complete the form for reimbursement and send to CPS Transportation by September 30, 2008.

## Are you Seeing Green?

So are we, for a few reasons. In an effort to preserve resources and to cut the high cost of printing and mailing, Bishop Hartley will be implementing an e-mail communication software this school year. Its purpose will be:



**To communicate** with parents and guardians more often and quickly, especially for emergencies or unusual circumstances (e.g., the Blizzard of March '08);



**To conserve** paper, ink, postage and time by converting routine and scheduled communication, like *The Herald*, to an electronic form that is viewable and archivable on the website; and,



**To utilize e-mail survey functions** to understand the viewpoints of parents/guardians or receive honest feedback about our school.

Helping us **go green** requires the understanding and efforts of all our Hartley family. It will involve change and patience as we go through some learning curves to maximize its success.

## We will Need One E-Mail Address per Family

This requires you, as a parent or guardian of a student at Bishop Hartley, to help us build our e-mail list through a simple, quick and secure on-line form that will be set-up and available off the front page of our website ([www.bishop-hartley.org](http://www.bishop-hartley.org)). The on-line form will be available by August 14, 2008. Through the form, which will take approximately five minutes to step through, you will provide us with the following information for your family:



*Your first and last name, as the registering parent/guardian;*



*A reliable e-mail address for the purpose of receiving BHHS communication. This should be an e-mail which does not change frequently and which you check often. Ideally, it should also be an address which does not block images. As a rule, we will keep images to a minimum, but logos may be incorporated for ID or we may include an interesting photo when appropriate.*



*The name of your student(s) and his or her graduation year(s)*

If necessary, you may register two e-mail addresses for your student(s), but you must step through the process twice to do so. To keep our list manageable, a single e-mail is preferred.

Once submitted, the software will ask you to confirm your registration by sending you an e-mail to the address you have given during the registration process. ### ODU Dual Enrollment for Calculus I/II

A reminder to students taking Calculus I or Calculus II during the 2008-2009 school year:

In May, you received a packet of information from Ohio Dominican University about the Dual Enrollment Program. If you wish to participate in this program, your completed materials and fees must be mailed directly to ODU before August 20, 2008 if you have not already sent them.

### Calculator Information for the 2008-09 School Year

All students taking Geometry or Honors Geometry next for the 08-09 school year must have a TI 30 or Senario SC 121 scientific calculator by the first day of school.

All students taking Algebra II, Algebra II/ Trig, Senior Transition Math, Precalculus, Honors Precalculus, Calculus I, Calculus II, and Statistics next year must purchase a TI 83 or TI 83 Plus calculator. This calculator will be used every day in class, on the ACT, SAT, AP Calculus Test and in college. The calculators are available at local stores for various prices. You must bring your own TI 83 or TI 83 Plus calculator to math class the first day of school. Juniors and seniors may have a calculator on their tablets, but tablets may not be used on the ACT, SAT, AP Calc Test or on any test given in class.
