NURSE'S NOTES

For parents of all students:

Medical Authorization and all other medical forms can be picked up in the front office. Thank you for your continued patience and understanding as we work to get the forms onto our new website.

FOR PARENTS OF SENIORS:

All students entering the twelfth grade are required by state law to be fully immunized against Meningitis. To be fully immunized students must have 2 doses of the vaccine, but if a dose is received on or after the sixteenth birthday, only one dose is required. If you have questions or if you are unsure if your student has been fully immunized, contact me or your health care provider.

Documentation verifying that the immunization has been given is required for school attendance and must be submitted to the school nurse prior to entering the twelfth grade. If you have not submitted this documentation, **you must do so by September 13, or your child will be excluded from school.**
