His Eagle Scout Project was completed between August and October of 2018. He led a team of boy scouts in designing and building a series of 8 park benches to go around a new concrete patio at St Pius X church beside the new Parish Family Center. He used some of the funds to purchase a gas grill which his team assembled.

Bishop Hartley High School dedicated the new Telerski & Casson Center (TACC) on Tuesday, September 24, 2019.

Bishop Frederick Campbell celebrated Homecoming Mass for the student body and blessed the new facility which is named in honor of two retired Hartley educators. Other special guests in attendance were Deacon Kelley and Deacon Zimmerman; Susan Streitenberger from the Office of Catholic Schools; Bruce Boylan from Diocesan Facilities, retired teachers Dick Geyer, Tim Grannan and Kathy Servick; Architect John Eberts '78; representatives from Sullivan Builders; and other honored guests: Paul '61 & Deborah Coleman, Sandra Grosko, Peggy Mackessy, Eric '94 & Jennifer Motter, and Karen Page.

Beginning in 1966 and continuing until his retirement in 2005, Robert Telerski served as teacher and coach, model and mentor to a countless number of students of Bishop Hartley High School. He was truly a "Renaissance Man" who shared his talents and passions with the Hartley community for 40 years.

After teaching at Fr. Wehrle High School and serving as Diocesan Director of Curriculum, Barbara Casson returned to her alma mater in 1999 as Assistant Principal and Academic Dean. Barbara supervised establishment of the Notre Dame program, the first formal program in the Diocese to address needs of students with learning disabilities.
