## NEW ALL-PURPOSE ON CAMPUS BUILDING BLESSED

Bishop Hartley High School dedicated the new Telerski & Casson Center on Tuesday, September 24.

Bishop Frederick Campbell celebrated Homecoming Mass for the student body and blessed the new facility named in honor of Robert Telerski and Barbara Casson, two retired Hartley educators. Special guests in attendance included Deacon Kelley and Deacon Zimmerman; Susan Streitenberger from the Office of Catholic Schools; Bruce Boylan from Diocesan Facilities, retired teachers Dick Geyer, Tim Grannan, and Kathy Servick; Architect John Eberts; representatives from Sullivan Builders; and other honored guests: Paul '61 & Deborah Coleman, Sandra Grosko, Peggy Mackessy, Eric '94 & Jennifer Motter, and Karen Page.

Beginning in 1966 and continuing until his retirement in 2005, Robert Telerski served as teacher and coach, model and mentor to a countless number of students of Bishop Hartley High School. He was truly a "Renaissance Man" who shared his talents and passions with the Hartley community for 40 years.

After teaching at Fr. Wehrle High School and serving as Diocesan Director of Curriculum, Barbara Casson returned to her alma mater in 1999 as Assistant Principal and Academic Dean. Casson supervised establishment of the Notre Dame program, the first formal program in the Diocese to address needs of students with learning disabilities.

The Telerski & Casson Center was funded through Development efforts. Upcoming celebrations will give thanks to project donors.
