SCHOOL PROFILE

The Community

Bishop Hartley High School is a coed, 4-year Catholic high school serving east Columbus and its neighboring suburbs: Bexley, Whitehall, Canal Winchester, Pickerington, Reynoldsburg, and Gahanna.

The School

Founded in 1957 by the Diocese of Columbus and named for the longest serving Bishop of the Diocese, James A. Hartley, we are a college preparatory school, accredited by the Ohio Catholic School Accrediting Association and the State of Ohio. We are in session 180 days, with a school day of 7 class periods of 50 minutes, 7:45-2:45. Following the last bell, we offer a SEEK Period (Students Extending and Enhancing Knowledge) Monday-Thursday, a time in which students can meet with teachers for tutoring consultation.

We offer a college preparatory curriculum based on the State of Ohio learning curriculum and Catholic teaching; our graduation requirements meet and exceed state standards. Ninety-eight percent of our graduates matriculate to college; last year our graduating class earned more than \$14.6 million in academic scholarships. The 2019-2020 enrollment is 717 with the senior class accounting for 168 students. The ratio of students to teachers is approximately 12:1 and the ratio of students to counselors is approximately 229:1.

Curriculum

Advanced Placement and Honors Courses

Honors level courses are offered in English and Mathematics at all grade levels, as well as in Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Religion. Advanced Placement courses are offered in American Government, American History, Biology, Calculus AB, Computer Science Principles, English 11 Language and Composition, English 12 Literature and Composition, French, Italian, Spanish, Studio Art: 2D, 3D & Drawing. College courses in Calculus I and II, Engineering, and Statistics are also offered.

Proficiency-based World Language Classes

The World Language Department uses a proficiency-based evaluation system. Students in Spanish, French and Italian classes need to achieve a grade of B- (80) or above in four skill areas — reading, writing, speaking and listening — to earn credit. Students in Latin classes need to be proficient (grade of B- [80] or above) in two skill areas — reading and writing.

Notre Dame Program

This program coordinates support for students who have been diagnosed with a disability that affects them in the educational setting. It services students who have been placed on a Services Plan, Academic Support Plan, or Medical Plan. The Notre Dame team consists of three Intervention Specialists who work closely with the rest of the Educational Services team to track student progress, enable teachers to address specific needs, provide accommodations and communicate with parents.

GRADING SYSTEM

Bishop Hartley uses an unweighted 4.0 grading scale for its College Prep and General Courses. An in-class weighted 4.0 grading scale is used for Advanced Placement and Honors Courses.

Beginning with the graduating Class of 2018, students need to meet the core subject testing criteria established by the State of Ohio in order to be eligible to receive a diploma.

RANK IN CLASS

House System

Bishop Hartley's House System is currently in its tenth year. The primary purpose of the House System is to further the mission of the school by providing greater pastoral care to all students while strengthening our sense of community. Our House System assures that students are embraced in the "Hartley Family Spirit" while recognizing them for their gifts and talents.

In partnership with the House System, each student earns 0.25 credits of leadership per school year. Through the leadership course, students will be provided with the knowledge and skills necessary for effective mentoring, intentional leadership, character development, and service to others in the school and community.
