National Merit Names Scholars

WE ARE PLEASED TO ANNOUNCE THAT SENIOR, ASYA Saelim-Ector HAS BEEN NAMED A SEMIFINALIST BY THE NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; SENIORS ELYSE AMORATI AND GABRIELLE TANNER HAVE BEEN NAMED COMMENDED STUDENTS.

Semifinalists continue in the competition for some 7500 National Merit Scholarships worth more than \$32 million. Approximately 90 percent of the Semifinalists are expected to attain Finalist standing, and approximately half of the Finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship, earning the title Merit Scholar®.

Approximately 1.6 million juniors in more than 22,000 high schools qualified for the National Merit Scholarship Program by taking the 2018 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying test (PSAT/NMSQT), which served as an initial screen of program entrants. The Semifinalists represent less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors and include the highest scoring entrants in each state.

About 34,000 Commended Students throughout the nation are being recognized for their exceptional academic promise. Commended Students placed among the top five percent of more than 1.6 million students who entered the 2019 competition.
