Common App - Scholar Snapp

Common App has made it easy for applicants to access scholarship opportunities directly through your admissions application. Scholar Snapp makes it easier for students to apply for scholarship by allowing you to apply to multiple scholarships without having to re-enter your information each time. Instead, you can reuse your information from one application to another. Fill out one application and simply import it, or “snapp” it, to a Scholar Snapp profile to use again next time.

Steps:

1. Connect to Scholar Snapp in the Financial Aid Resources tab of your Common App
2. Log in to your Scholar Snapp account, or register for a new account
3. Give permission for Common App to access and transfer your data to Scholar Snapp

Bexley Women's Club

The Bexley Women's Club scholarship program, a primary focus of the club, began in 1937 when \$50 scholarships were awarded to two women students attending Capital University and The Ohio State University. Modest by today's standards, those \$50 scholarships paid the women's tuition with some left over for additional expenses.

Today's scholarship program is open to high school seniors who are residents of Bexley. Since its inception, the Bexley Women's Club scholarship program has awarded more than \$525,000 to approximately 890 deserving students.

Who Should Apply

- All high school seniors with at least a 2.5 GPA who reside in Bexley. They may attend BHS, **private** or charter schools or be home-schooled.
- Applicants need not be associated with Bexley Women's Club.

How to Apply: Bexley Women's Club supports our community each year by providing \$1,500 scholarships to graduating high school seniors. Applicants must be legal residents of Bexley. Recipients are selected based on merit, community involvement, and financial need through a blind review of submitted applications. **The application process for this year is from Monday December 23, 2019 – Sunday March 22, 2020**

The William D. Squires Educational Foundation, Inc.

Eligibility:

1. Primarily based upon financial need. The EFC on your FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR) must be less than 7,000 to apply.
2. Applicants must already know their career goal
3. Applicants must be highly motivated and have good character
4. Applicants must show academic promise; minimum 3.20 GPA

Award: \$5,000 renewable financial need-based undergraduate scholarship

Deadline: Applications will be accepted from February 15 until April 5

Apartment Guide Scholarship

To be eligible to enter this scholarship contest, applicants:

- Must be at least 17 years old
- Must be a U.S. citizen or otherwise legally residing in 1 of the 50 United States or the District of Columbia
- Must be enrolled in or accepted as a full-time student at an accredited college or university for the Fall 2020 semester
- Must be pursuing an undergraduate education
- Have a minimum 2.5 GPA

We know that housing, books, fees, and study abroad costs can be major expenditures for students and their families so we're allowing the winners to use the funds for non-tuition costs if they choose. All funds must go towards an education-related expense. This could be school books, class fees, dormitory housing, meal plans, etc.

Award: Two \$2,500 scholarships for the Fall 2019 semester

League of United Latin American Citizens' (LULAC, www.lulac.org)

LULAC Councils will award scholarships to qualified Latino students who are enrolled or are planning to enroll in accredited colleges or university in the United States. Awards start at \$250. Awards of \$500 and under are disbursed on July 15th; awards over \$500 are disbursed in two equal payments on July 15th and January 15th. All awards are sent to the local LULAC Councils for distribution to recipients. Scholarships may be used for the payment of tuition, academic fees, room, board, and the purchase of required educational materials & books. A student may not accept more than one LNESCS-sponsored scholarship award in a given academic year.

The basic requirements to qualify for a scholarship are as follows:

- Be a Central Ohio Resident
- For the 2019-2020 Academic School Year Must be either
 - An Incoming or Current College/University Student, Or
 - Incoming or Current Graduate Student
- Current Legal Status should not be a deterrent, as we are allocating scholarships for DACA students or students who have no fixed immigration status
- The Honors Award requires particular GPA and ACT/SAT scores
 - The student must have a GPA of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale, and, if the student is an incoming freshman, he/she must have a score of 23 or higher on the ACT test, or 1100 or higher on the SAT test (sum of critical reading and math scores).

The application must be received at 460 East Main Street Columbus OH, via mail or in person by **5:00 pm on March 31, 2020**.

Scholarship recipients will be notified of their award on June 15, 2019. They will be expected to Complete a 4 hour In-Person College Readiness Course, 2 in addition to 15 hours of community service.

St. John the Baptist – Italian Catholic Church – Father Casto Marrapese Scholarship

Info: To provide financial assistance and encouragement to a student of **Italian descent** to pursue a course of study in an accredited two or four year college or university in the U.S.

Award: Seven seniors attending a high school in the Central Ohio area, and who plan to begin their collegiate studies, directly after high school, will be awarded a **\$2,000 Scholarship** – paid directly to the institution.

Deadline: 2 pm Monday, **April 6, 2020** (delivered to St. John the Baptist Italian Catholic Church or Cultural Center).

The following documents are required from each applicant (all materials must be provided in **one package/envelope**):

- The Scholarship Application Form completed legibly
- List of activities (or a resume) which includes Honors, Awards, and Activities from school, church or community organizations (preferably no longer than one page). The student should include specific information on any activities they have participated in regarding their Italian heritage, including (but no limited to) volunteering at the Italian Festival, taking Italian language/culture classes, or formal studies in Italy.
- School Recommendation Form completed and signed by a school Counselor, including ACT/SAT test scores
- **One** Personal Recommendation (additional recommendations will not be considered)
- Transcript of High School Grades
- Student's Personal Essay, no more than two (2) typed, double-spaced pages. The essay question is included on the Application Form.

Greater Columbus Chapter of the Association of Government Accountants Scholarship Awards – 2020

Eligibility Requirements:

- Must currently be pursuing a degree in one of the following financial management academic disciplines:

- Provide a professional letter of recommendation
- Provide essay explaining what field you chose to study and why you chose it
- Provide academic transcript

Academic Achievement Criteria: Scholarships will be awarded based on the candidate's potential for making a meaningful contribution to the financial management profession. Candidates must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

Letters of Recommendation: All scholarship candidates must include a reference letter from a professional such as professor, guidance counselor, employer, etc. written on professional letterhead and submitted electronically.

Required Essay: Scholarship candidates must submit a typed essay, in electronic format (PDF preferred) to greatercolumbusaga@gmail.com. The essay should be double-spaced and should not exceed 500 words. Please ensure that your full name is on the document.

- Demonstrate financial need; applicants must be Pell Grant eligible
- Be under the age of 30
- Be a United States citizen

Bill of Rights Institute Scholarship – We the Students Essay Contest

Criteria: Students in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, American Armed Forces schools abroad, and students in United States territories are eligible to participate in the contest. In addition to going to school in a contest state, you must be in grades 8-12 and between the ages of 14-19.

Each submission must adhere to the topics and should fully answer the question and all sub-parts. Each submission must adhere to the word limits for each question (between 500 and 800 words), and must be submitted by 11:59 pm PT on April 15, 2020. Only online submissions will be accepted for the contest. Only one essay per student will be accepted.

Winners will be announced on the contest site on or before May 31, 2020. Winners must provide publicity photos and information as well as Social Security numbers in order to receive prize money. Social Security numbers are requested from winners for tax purposes only. The Bill of Rights Institute does not sell, nor use student Social Security numbers for any reason other than the required reporting for Federal tax purposes.

Winners will receive the following prizes based upon the judges' evaluations as outlined in Section IV.

Award: Cash prizes for Students in the We The Students Scholarship Essay Contest:

National Grand Prize – \$7,500 (plus a scholarship to Constitutional Academy)

Runners Up – Five at \$1,500 each

Honorable Mention – Eight at \$500 each
