Dear Parents:

During these challenging times, we want to help our Seniors feel a bit of normalcy, so we have planned a Spirit Week in place of some of the homecoming festivities which are not possible this year. These events are planned through our House System.

The week of October 12th-17th week will be filled with activities which allow students to experience each of our 6 pillars:

Service: We will hold a drive to benefit Birthright Columbus. Items may be turned in Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday.

Items needed:

- Baby clothes size 0-9 months (can be new or used)
- Baby towels & washcloths
- Baby body wash
- Diapers (newborn & size 1 preferred)
- Baby wipes

Students will drop donations in boxes designated for each house as they enter the building. Points will be awarded in the House Competition based on the number of items collected.

Faith: Students will participate in a prayer service Monday and Tuesday. These are Red and Blue dress days.

Preparation: National Testing Day is October 14th.

Spirit: We will have a spirit assembly to Honor all fall sports on Thursday and Friday. These are Western theme dress days. Students who would like to be in a theme dress competition should have their picture taken at lunch the day they are in the building. Leadership: School Captains will present to the school for the first time this year.

We have planned two events for Seniors only to allow them to enjoy some fun together. The first is a game watch event in the TACC on Friday night to watch the football playoff game. Students must stay until the end of the game (approximately 9:30).
