AP U.S. History Assignment 2021-2022

Part 1 Due: First Day of School

Students should visit a museum or other historical sites and write about the experience in a journal format. DO NOT GO ON ANY VISIT WITHOUT YOUR PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIANS PRIOR KNOWLEDGE AND/OR APPROVAL.

The following is a list of suggested places to visit. Basically, if the site has the word "Museum" in it, it will be fine to use for credit. If you have other ideas, let me know. **(If it becomes difficult to visit a museum due to COVID -19 I will accept a virtual tour. However, I ask that you please do your best to plan for an onsite visit.)**

- Ohio Historical Society & Ohio Village in Columbus, Ohio
- The Thurber House in Columbus, Ohio
- Motts Military Museum in Groveport, Ohio
- National Air Force Museum in Dayton, Ohio
- Underground Railroad Museum in Cincinnati, Ohio

If you travel the country during the summer consider any well-known museum in New York, Washington D.C., Chicago etc. National Battlefields are also permissible (i.e. Yorktown, Lexington / Concord, Antietam, Gettysburg etc.).

Steps for Museum Visit and Credit:

1. Inform your parents / legal guardian of your plans to travel to the museum. Do not attend without parental / guardian permission.
2. Visit and tour the Museum / Site – have a notebook and pen with you to jot down what you have learned and your reactions to your visit.
3. Compose a 2 – 3-page typed Reflection Paper (Double Spaced – 12 Font, Times New Roman). Describe your visit and what you learned. This is one of the few papers that you may use “I” statements. You will turn in a hardcopy of the paper to Mr. Dinovo on the first day of school. Take pictures of you visiting the museum / historic site. Attach the pictures to the back of your reflection paper. Be prepared to discuss your visit during the first week of school.

Part 2 Due: First Day of School

Read: *The AMERICAN SPIRIT: WHO WE ARE and WHAT WE STAND FOR* by David McCullough

- As you read, take notes simply answering the question; According to David McCullough, who are we and what do we stand for? Feel free to highlight ideas in the book since you purchased it. We will be doing a group project early on in the year based on this reading.
